Contact Hours

This course is composed of 24 lecture sessions, 3 tutorial sessions and 9 office hours. Each lecture session takes 2 contact hours in length; each tutorial session takes 3 contact hours in length; There will be a Q-A review session(3 contact hours) and Final Exam (3 contact hours) at the end of this term. This course has 72 contact hours in total.

Course Description

In this class we will explore several major and overlapping areas of social psychology. Social psychology is the scientific study of how people's thoughts, feelings, and behaviors are influenced by the actual, imagined, or implied presence of others. In this course, we will deal with the research, theory, and methodology of social psychology as well as classic and contemporary approaches. This course puts emphasis on the social relations, behaviors and connections to the related fields of psychology. Besides that, the course will primarily be based on discussion, although you can sometimes get further information about research findings whenever you want.
